

Osmotherley, Mount Grace Priory and Scarth Wood Moor - The 8-mile (with 1215ft of ascent) **YELLOW** walk from Osmotherley, which has both a medieval church and an 18th Century Methodist chapel, has a decidedly ecclesiastical flavour with a restored Tudor chapel nearby, beside a small hilltop wood. Indeed, a detour in order to visit the superb remains of this Carthusian monastery is highly recommended. It is a grand scenic walk, which hugs the edge of the Cleveland escarpment to continue across Scarth Wood Moor, where there are fine views of the surrounding Cleveland hills. The return follows a section of the Hambleton drove road before swinging off the moor and crossing a delightful wooded valley on its way back into Osmotherley.
